



Set just NE of the rath FER 244:005, in an area of dense scrub which makes the tomb difficult to see. The site is located only 6m outside the outer edge of the rath ditch. The tomb consists of 3 stones, forming the sides of a chamber orientated NW-SE. Closest to the rath, forming the SW side of the chamber, are 2 large slabs, set end to end. A single slab forms the NE side ofthe chamber. No further definite stones could be identified, although there is another large slab lying flat, just visible in the undergrowth at SW. The whole is surrounded by signs of collapsed modern walling.

On the E summit of Cuilcagh Mt., at the highest point in Co. Fermanagh, commanding extensive views all round. The summit of the mountain is an almost level plateau with many outcropping sandstones. This circular cairn of sandstone boulders is 19m diam. & 3.5m high. An OS triangulation pillar has been erected on top of it. Most of the cairn is in Co. Cavan, with only the N section in Fermanagh. W of the cairn, in Cavan, are 2 circular stone structures, 6.8m & 7m in diam., probably the remains of round houses.

On a small terrace at the head of a glen on the E flanks of Cuilcagh Mt. This site is not recorded on any OS map, but was noted in PSAMNI as four boulders which might be the remains of a stone circle. A low bank of small limestone boulders, 2.8m wide & c.0.3m high, is well preserved in an arc NW-N-WSW & terminates as an oval pile of cairn material at SW. Four lime stone orthostats on the crest of the bank at N & NE & a 5th stone on the WSW. The bank has a diameter of approxiametely 10m. This would appear to be the remains of a round house.

STANDING STONE

On level ground at the head of a small valley & 100m SW of a rath [FER 224:005]. This stone, designated "Standing Stone" on the OS 6" map, is an upright stone 1.55m high, 0.7m wide & 0.4m thick. There is some slight mounding of the ground around the stone, but this may not be ancient. The surface of the stone was fractured when a fire was lit against it in 1977. The stone is now broken into two sections. A small stump remains embedded in the ground, standing 0.4 -0.6m high aboove the surrounding ground, while the remainder lies at the foot of the stump.

This standing stone is near Wilson's farm.

On level upland overlooked by Benaughlin Mt. to S. This complex, circular site, 35m diam., consist of a SW-sloping platform, 1.3m high, with slight traces of a perimeter bank at NW & NNE-NE. This is surrounded by a ditch, 2m wide, NNE-S-W. Vestiges of a stony counterscarp bank 4.4m wide, survive at NNE & SW-W, standing 0.9m above the ditch & 0.5m above the exterior. A causeway in the ditch at E is probably the original entrance. At the platform's centre is a collapsed stone structure, probably a round house.

CUP AND RING MARKED STONE

Search the NISMR database >> CUP AND RING MARKED STONE

This stone is in a dramatic setting on high, boggy ground, with good views to SW, NW and over an extensive sweep of the lakelands to E. The cup and ring marks are on the flat SW-facing surface of a large boulder, 1.9m long, 1.12m wide & 0.6m thick. The flat, decorated surface appears to have been deliberately placed to face S & the decoration shows up very clearly with winter sun on the stone. There are 3 conjoined cup & ring markes, c. 0.25m in diam., with 2 belong and one above in a roughly triangular arrangement, set in the middle of the stone. There are also 4 circular hollows c.0.1m in diam., set vertically above the upper cup & ring. Overall, the decorated features are c.0.95m long & a max. of 0.48m wide. There are several other prehistoric features in the area & the landscape is dominated by the round cairn on the summit of Cuilcagh, to SW.

This oval rath, 25m NW-SE x 19m NE-SW, contains an interior which reflects the natural slope. It is formed SW-NE by a denuded stony bank & ENE-S by a steep natural scarp. Within a circle of natural swallow holes are the remains of a court tomb. The site survives as a peat covered long cairn aligned NE-SW. It is 15.5m long x 9m wide at NE, tapering to 5m wide at the SW end. A single court stone, 0.92m high, stands at E, close to a pair of entrance portals. Peat digging along the N side of the mound has exposed 3 side stones of the gallery. A single stone is visible on the S side, indicating a gallery 1.8m wide. The roofing stones are missing, but some cairn stones are visible.



MULTIPLE CIST CAIRN

On a local eminence 600m SW of the summit of Benaughlin, with excellent views all round. The cairn is composed of limestone boulders & slabs. It is well defined, with an enclosing ditch 2m wide & measures $16.2m\ N-S\ x$ $17.5m\ E-W$, standing $1.8m\ high$. There is now no visible indication of cists within the cairn. Excavations by Wakeman produced evidence of a central oval cist $6ft\ x\ 4ft\ x\ 4ft\ (1.8m\ x\ 1.2m\ x\ 1.2m)$, roofed with 2 large flag stones. There were a number of cists around the perimeter, containing calcined bone. See SM7 for further details.



ST. LASSER'S CELL

Built into a mound on top of a long ridge. The souterrain opens out to S. On either side of the entrance, the ground has been revetted with drystone walling & an opening 1m wide leads to a small chamber, $2.3 \, \text{m} \times 1.5 \, \text{m} \times 0.65 \, \text{m}$ high. At the end of it, a lintelled creep would provide access in to the rest of the souterrain, but is now blocked by soil. PSAMNI described it as "...chambers connected by passages". There are 3 chambers. The last one extends SE with a doorway to the outside, is shaped like a beehive cell [CF, 1986]. Topsoil stripping in a field W of the souterrain was carried out under archaeological supervision, prior to development. No archaeological features or materials were found [ACS, 1999].

Inishee is a small wooded island in Lough MacNean Lower. At its centre is a steep earthen mound 60m NE-SW x 33m NW-SE & 5m high. It was excavated in 1939 by Davies, who tentatively concluded it to be a natural mound with artificially scarped sides & levelled summit. No evidence was found to indicate substantial settlement. The island is referred to in the Annals of the Four Masters as Inis Octa, the site of a battle in 1499. However, Davies felt that Inis Octa was actually Port Island in Lough MacNean Upper.

This small stone was found during hedge clearance. It was toppled over and was lifted by the digger driver and set back into the field boundary. It stands 0.94m high, although a further 0.15m can be seen running down into the ground. It measures 0.43m wide at the base, tapering to 0.22m at the top & 0.26m deep. Although this is quite small for a standing stone, a Bronze Age archer's wrist bracer has been found in the vicinity, and the owner also mentioned a "bronze sword" found nearby, indicating that there could well have been some Bronze Age activity in the area.
